I am excited with the prospects of NNSG's plans for the year ahead: educational activities, summer SWEATCo projects, and watershed planning, to name a few.

### **News Items**

Nevada's 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Sage-Grouse Workshop reported on the many interesting studies underway that will aid in understanding conservation of the greater sage-grouse. Through the watershed planning process, NNSG will add to the database of information specific to sage-grouse in northeastern Nevada.

June of 2005 - NNSG joined with Agriculture Research Services, Cheyenne, WY to acquire very large-scale aerial (VLSA) imagery on a 25,000 acre plot. Rangeland assessment on western landscapes is challenging. VLSA offers a vegetation data collection that is low in cost, repeatable, and can be studied by all interests. NNSG believes this technology will assist in the watershed assessment process. N-1 Grazing Board, Bureau of Land Management, Cortez Mines, supported this project.

Range Management School (RMS) has come to Nevada. In 2004, NNSG initiated a RMS presentation by Robbi LeValle, coordinator for RMS CO. Colorado has a tenyear history of engaging ranchers, agency members and publics in the science of "how grass grows," and how livestock and grass grow best together. After an introductory presentation in December of 2005, the 2006 season will begin Nevada RMS Team's work with Nevada livestock communities. Kent McAdoo played a significant role in establishing RMS in Nevada.

NNSG pilots the BLM Partnership Series course, Science in Service of Stewardship. In February 2006, thirty participants engaged with trainers over a two-day period to discuss how science is utilized within the collaborative forum. Engaging in scientific discussions requires that good relationships exist, and that the important scientific questions be framed together by the group, such as, "How can we conserve species...while retaining our livestock industry?" As simple as it sounds, speaking from a common vision is essential to securing "best science", and to avoiding potential conflicts. USFS, BLM, and Elko County Conservation Districts supported the training.
